Q. 96 to 100: Earth is facing a great danger created by continued and indiscriminate denudation of forests and other natural resources as well as rising of pollution level, which, unless is met effectively, will certainly bring a disaster to the mankind. Like others we, librarians, can do a bit by setting up green libraries and converting the existing ones into such libraries initiating green library movement. The term 'Green' or 'Sustainable', according to Online Oxford Dictionary, refers to "conserving an ecological balance by avoiding depletion of natural resources". In this context, a green library may be described as one that is echo friendly from all angles. It is "designed to minimize negative impact on the natural environment and maximize indoor environmental quality by means of careful site selection, use of natural construction materials and biodegradable products, conservation of resources (water, energy, paper) and responsible waste disposal (recycling, etc.)". B. Brown has identified some design elements which can be incorporated in the design of libraries to make them green libraries. These are: efficient use of community assets and maintaining public support; balancing use of daylight with artificial lighting; use of green or renewable materials like wood, bamboo, cork etc.; having green roofs and raised floor systems; ensuring energy efficiency and natural ventilation; use of green power and renewable energy and maintaining indoor environment quality. It may be recalled that a 'Go Green Initiative' was started in 2002 by Jill Buck in California, which gave new meaning to the term GREEN (G for Generate less waste,

R for Recycle everything that can be reused, E for Educate the community on eco-friendly options, E for Evaluate the environmental impact of actions and N for Nourish discussions and activities that integrate environmental education into existing curriculum). Even before this development, an international agreement known as Kyoto Protocol linked to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, had been adopted in 1997, which commits all the countries of the world by setting up internationally binding emission reduction targets. Though setting up of green libraries was advocated in LIS literature in 1990s, a green library movement gained popularity only in the beginning of the new millennium or more precisely around 2003. The green library movement was inspired by American Sustainable Communities Movement, but mostly the early efforts in this sphere were focused on ecological sustainable buildings. According to New World Encyclopedia, among other things, green libraries maximize the effects of natural sun light and natural air flow; green libraries are thoughtfully designed while taking into account site selection to structural design, energy use, materials used and human health effects. Moreover, such libraries also educate the public about environment friendly issues through their collections, sustainable and environment friendly facilities and public library programmes.
